# *The Christian Bible as a Text of Migration*

From *Genesis* through *Revelation*, the Jewish and Christian Bibles depict migration and responses to migration. Given the prominent role of the Bible in public life today, politicians, thinkers, and migrants themselves have turned to those texts to reflect on just and appropriate immigration policies. Dr. Hidalgo will question some more contemporary political interpretations of the Bible. She will also discuss the Bible as a text of migration.



Dr. Hidalgo holds a B.A. from Columbia University, an M.A. from Union Theological Seminary, and a Ph.D. in Religion from Claremont Graduate University. Her recent publications include *Revelation in Aztlán: Scriptures, Utopias, and the Chicano Movement* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2016), and *Latinxs, the Bible, and Migration*, co-edited with Efrain Agosto, (Palgrave Macmillan, 2018).
